At elementary school, I taught Math, English, PE, Music and Art; in America it's common for elementary school teachers to teach multiple subjects. my free time I enjoy sports, movies, going to concerts, singing, playing guitar, and performing.

However, performing fills me with the most passion. My performances have included playing original songs, acting in theatrical plays, standup comedy—a single person telling jokes and stories on stage, and improv—a group of actors who create an original play in real time based on an audience suggestion

I lived in Los Angeles the last 8 years, but I grew up in Chicago, a lakeside metropolis in northern America. Chicago is a wonderful city, full of gorgeous buildings and fun cultural activities. It was a great place to grow up. Chicagoans create a warm atmosphere with their kind personalities, but the weather can be brutal. In Chicago, people often have to dig their buried cars out of the snow during the long, frigid winters.

Los Angeles is a great city, too, but for different reasons. Los Angeles is the largest city on America's west coast. It sits near mountains, forests, and the ocean. It's usually warm in the city, even in the winter, but you can drive to the beach and surf, and then drive into the cold mountains to ski in the same day. Los Angeles is probably best known for being the entertainment capital of America because lots of music, television, and movies are made there. It's an exciting place.

As a teenager, I saw the movie Lost in Translation–a movie about an American actor who feels out of place while working in Tokyo until he bonds with another American visitor.. I immediately felt drawn to visit Tokyo and explore the neon wonderland myself, but it took more than a decade for me to finally visit. In 2018, I visited Tokyo and Kyoto and loved every moment. It was so fun that I decided to return for three months in 2019, intent on experiencing Japan outside of the major tourist destinations. Through World Wide Opportunities on Organic Farms (WWOOF), a homestay network of organic farmers, I stayed with families in Hiroshima, Kumamoto and Nagano prefectures. I also volunteered at a school in Kagoshima prefecture for one month. Those three months were the best of my life. Some of my favorite memories are chatting with locals at farmers markets, relaxing in hot springs, and enjoying a spiritual sojourn on Mount Koya.

Since I've lived my life in big cities so far, I want to have a different experience in Japan. I'm glad that I can walk less than a kilometer from my apartment here in Miyakonojo and find myself surrounded by fields. I look forward to knowing Miyakonojo, both its way of life and its residents, more deeply through my time living here.


No reservations in advance. Please buy a ticket beforehand. As the seating is pre-determined, please purchase a ticket ASAP. There are no same day tickets.
